

**ANA PEREIRA FERREIRA** was born in Lisbon in 1985.

She graduated in History in the Faculty of Arts of the University of Lisbon (2007), and holds a master's degree in Palaeography and Diplomatics (2012) also from the same institution. Her dissertation, supervised by Bernardo Sá-Nogueira, is entitled "Análise Paleográfica de uma escrita de Chancelaria Régia: a Letra Joanina, 1370-1420".

Ana was a PhD candidate of the Inter-University PhD Programme in History (PIUDHist) with the thesis entitled "The city of Lisbon and the university: the royal public notary and the power of writing, 1377-1438", under the supervision of Hermínia Vilar and Maria Helena Cruz Coelho. The thesis was delivered to the academic services of the University of Évora in October 2022, and is now waiting for the scheduling of public examinations to obtain the doctoral degree.

She is an integrated non-doctoral researcher of CIDEHUS-UÉvora and collaborating researcher of the CH-ULisboa.

Ana was a grant holder of the project funded by the Foundation for Science and Technology (FCT), *Oeconomia Studii* from April 2017 to March 2019 and a PhD grant holder by the FCT from April 2019 to August 2022.

She has developed several national and international communications on the theme of the notary and power of writing in medieval times, from which have resulted some articles.

She was Co-editor of the works *Fontes para o Estudo da Presença de Judeus na Península Ibérica durante a Idade Média*, *As Diásporas dos Judeus e Cristãos-Novos de Origem Ibérica entre o Mar Mediterrâneo e o Oceano Atlântico. Estudos* and the eBook, still in progress, *Paleografia e Diplomática na senda das Humanidades Digitais: caminhos e propostas*.

Ana was part of the organisation of some seminars and congresses, namely the seminar "Science, Teaching and Society in Perspective" held at FLUL on 20 September 2018; the international congress "Jews of Portugal and Spanish-Portuguese Jews in Diaspora" held at FLUL and FLUP from 26 June to 2 July 2019; the International Congress "Palaeography and Diplomatics on the path of Digital Humanities: paths and proposals", held in May 2021; and the "II International Congress of Palaeography and Diplomatics", held at the university of Évora in May 2022. Presently she's preparing, along with the remaining

organization committee, the "III International Congress of Palaeography and Diplomatics", to be held in May 2023, at the university of Évora.

In the last two years (2021 and 2022) she taught a few classes of the "Workshop of Palaeography" integrated in the Summer School 2021 of the University of Évora, and also in the master's program in Medieval History at the University of Coimbra.

She is a member, since 2019, of the Portuguese Society for Medieval Studies.

Her main areas of interest are Palaeography, Diplomatics, Cultural and Social History, especially in the medieval period.
