Main Themes:

In accordance with the predominant line at the time he began his research, within the team led at the *Universidad Autónoma de Madrid* by Professor Martínez Millán, he applied the political-sociological methodology of power groups and personal relations to the study of the institutional evolution of the Royal Council of Castile in the time of Philip II (Philip I of Portugal), which at the same time allowed him to make contributions in the field of prosopography and biography of its members, and of the Social History of the Administration. Subsequently, having perceived the importance of the extended royal domestic government as a broad context in which the Royal Council was integrated, a jurisdictional vector of territorial application of the royal attributions as

paterfamilias, he made various contributions that sought to understand this function of the body, as a little applied tool to the knowledge of the History of Modern Administration, among which stands out the book *El Consejo Real de Castilla en el espacio cortesano* (2017).

A research project carried out at CEDIS between 2008 and 2011, thanks to a postdoctoral contract funded by the Fundação Ciência e Tecnologia (SFRH/BPD/41300/2007), under the guidance of Professor António Manuel Hespanha, focused on the administrative interaction between the Spanish monarchy and the kingdom of Portugal in the period of the *Filipes*, which underlined the value of the latter as an administrative model for Castile and the monarchy as a whole, allowed him to expand his area of attention to the Atlantic kingdom. Since then, he has maintained the relationship with the aforementioned Portuguese research centre in the person of Professor Cristina Nogueira da Silva, investigating the projection of administrative and jurisdictional decisions in the Early Modern Age, from the restricted sphere of the king (the Royal Chamber) towards the space of the kingdom, and the respective process of domestic extension and territorial integration that it promoted, both in Castile and in Portugal. This was a hitherto little appreciated foundation for understanding the subsequent development of the Liberal State. This methodology also shapes his current research project, *The diffuse Court. The territorial articulation of royal jurisdiction (16th-18th centuries)*, carried out at the Universidad Rey Juan Carlos (Spain), under the tutelage of Professor Félix Labrador Arroyo, who in his day was essential in Ignacio Ezquerro's further research into Portuguese issues. He wants to finish this brief note mentioning another professors who also influenced his orientation towards Portuguese subjects: José Subtil, Pedro Cardim and Laurinda Abreu, to whom he is also very grateful for their valous help.
