



**Paulo Teodoro de Matos** graduated in History in 1997 (Universidade Nova de Lisboa) and holds a PhD in Historical Demography (Universidade do Minho, 2004)

As a post-doctoral researcher he has developed the projects 'Goa from the *Anciën Regime* to the Liberalism: Demography, family and inheritance, 1720-1830' (Universidade Católica Portuguesa/University of Goa) and 'Demographic Trends of the Portuguese Atlantic, 1750-1820' (Universidade Nova de Lisboa/The Johns Hopkins University).

He was Assistant Professor at the Portuguese Catholic University and Research Fellow at Nova University (Ciência 2008 and Investigador FCT programmes). Since 2019 he is Assistant Professor at Instituto Universitário de Lisboa (ISCTE-IUL), Department of History. His main research activities are related to Historical Demography, Social History and History of the Portuguese Expansion. Recently he has been also interested in studying prices and wages in the Portuguese Indic Ocean, 1500-1650. He is the PI of the international research project "Counting Colonial Populations. Demography and the uses of statistic in the Portuguese empire, 1776-1875" and member of the research project "Local and European Wages in the Portuguese Ocean, 1500-1650: new sources and analytical tools".
