

Rosa Maria dos Santos Capelão was born in Pereira (Mirandela) in 1975. When she was one year old, her parents emigrated and settled in A Rúa (Ourense, Spain). She obtained a Nursing degree at the University of Santiago de Compostela (1995-1998).

She lived in Matosinhos from 2001 to 2011. During this period, she worked as a nurse at ULS Matosinhos (2001-2009), and under as a student-worker, she graduated in History from the Faculty of Arts of the University of Porto (2002-2006). She received her PhD in History from the same University in 2011 with the thesis “The Cult of Relics in Portugal in the 16th-17th centuries. Context, Regulations, Functions and Symbolism”.

That same year 2011, after passing a public competition for nurse in the Servizo Galego de Saúde, she began working in the emergency department of the Public Hospital of Valdeorras, where she continues to work today.

Since she has carried out research work in History, specialized in medical ethics, and in September 2022 she began her studies in Philosophy at the University of Santiago de Compostela.

She has been a researcher at CITCEM, the Transdisciplinary Research Center «Culture, Space and Memory», at the University of Porto.

That the moment she is devoted to the following lines of research: women as intermediaries in the Portuguese Overseas Empire; women as agents of medical practice in the 16th and 17th centuries in Portugal; production and circulation of medical knowledge in the Iberian Empires; intercultural encounters in the Portuguese Overseas Empire; and finally, the role of beliefs and emotions in the healing processes.
